

Hampshire Gold Rose Criteria

The Hampshire Gold Rose is awarded to Commissioners and County/Division Appointment Holders when they have completed a successful term of office

This is the gift of the County Commissioner to give. Decisions regarding this award will be made on an individual basis. The decision of the County Commissioner is final.

The HGR is presented by the County Commissioner or her representative and should not be presented at the same time as long service or any other awards.

Hampshire Rose Criteria

The Hampshire Rose is awarded to Leaders, Commissioners and Appointment Holders when they retire from active uniformed guiding and have completed at least 30 years' service in Guiding, at least 15 of which must be in the County of Hampshire.

The Hampshire Rose is primarily a retirement award given in recognition of service to the County of Hampshire and is not to be regarded as a long service award.

The Hampshire Rose is presented by the County Commissioner or her representative and should not be presented at the same time as long service or any other awards.

A recipient would normally be living in Hampshire at the time of receiving the award. If at some point in the future they move away from the County they will continue to receive invitations to the lunch and other guiding events.

Receiving the Hampshire Rose does not prevent members undertaking other roles in Guiding for which they are eligible.

Decisions regarding this award will be made on an individual basis. The decision of the County Commissioner is final.
