The Five Essentials

Guiding uses a distinct method:

- Girls work in small groups
- Girls are encouraged to govern themselves and make their own decisions
- Girls have a balanced and varied programme
- Girls care for the individual
- Girls share a commitment to a common standard embodied in the Promise and Law
