

Wellies on tour - Norway edition!

Hi, we are Wandering Wellies Lone Ranger Senior Section (yes that is our full name or WWLRSS for short). We are a brand new lone ranger unit set up after we all attended Wellies and Wristbands in 2015. We now have 12 members who live all over the country, from Cardiff to London, Southampton to Warwick and one in Australia!

Often lone rangers have to be very resourceful with how they complete challenges. Many lones are students on tight budgets or unable to attend regular meetings due to other reasons such as work or ill health. On this basis – an activity can be completed any way you want for example if it says "Make...." You don't necessarily have to jump into the craft box – why not make out of food, or people?

We are fundraising for our first unit trip ever, which just so happens to be to Nord 2017 Jamboree in Norway! (why start small when you can jump right in... right?)


As part of this we have developed a "mini challenge badge" or "pick up and go activity pack" (which seems to be expanding)

This features everything you will need to run sessions with your girls. We have also tried to set it up so that the activities run in an order for either an hour or an hour and a half session.

We recommend doing at least two activities from each section to give a wide overview however you are welcome to do more activities if you wish or focus on 1 section. We would highly suggest doing the starter activities so girls learn where Norway is and a few basics. Sections are split into:

Guiding/Scouting in Norway

Geography

Lets test your geography skills - On a map can your girls find

- Their hometown?
- The last place they went on holiday?
- Norway?
- Oslo (the capital city)?
- Bodo?

Make or decorate a Norwegian flag


Colour the Norwegian flag (appendix 1)

 Make a flag pin badge from seed beads (appendix 2)

Norwegian Traditions, Life and Culture

Northern Lights

During Winter Bodo often sees the Northern Lights. Paint a silhouette picture showing the northern lights. Cut a silhouette from black paper to stick on top of your northern lights sky background.

Midnight sun

During the summer Bodo gets a grand total of 0 hours darkness.

Make a sleep mask

In the winter – the opposite happens – there are 0 hours of daylight.

Complete a blind trail or challenge.

Set up a trail or a series of challenge the unit must complete wearing blindfolds.

This is a very good trust exercise and good for developing team building skills.

Scandinavian Christmas hearts

This is a very traditional craft using 2 different coloured pieces of paper in Scandinavia especially in Denmark. Make a Christmas heart – these also make nice valentines day presents or a thinking day gifts.

Example of these can be found online along with instructions. They take less then 20mins to make and are very cheap. Due to copywrite rules we are not allowed to include the instructions (sorry!)

Vikings

Long boats

Make a long boat out of cardboard boxes – big enough for your whole patrol or unit to sail in.

If that is not possible why not make an individual rowing boat from a cardboard box. (places like McDonalds are fantastic at giving old cardboard boxes to units for free)



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Design your own sail.

Traditionally Viking flags are portrayed as being red and white striped. What would you have on your sail?

Make a Viking Mask

You could use a template from online or Appendix 3, scrap crafts or anything else you like.

Dress like a Viking

using old scrap materials, tin foil or bin bags – dress one person in your six/patrol as a Viking. Don't forget the helmet, shield and sword.

Make a Viking Helmet

Design and make your own 33iking helmet – think outside the box. It could be made from food, papier mache, an old football?

Make a Viking Runestone

Decorate stones using poster paint and PVA mix or acrylic paints

Or

Make stones out of airdry clay which you can engrave with symbols

Complete the maze

Help the Viking reach his boat using the maze in appendix 4

Trolls

Trolls often feature in Norwegian mythology and can be seen in many traditional stories, poems, songs and painting.

Did you know – Moomins are a species of troll.

Make a felt troll

Insert troll pic 1

You will need:

- Card cone template
- Felt
- Embroidery thread
- Cotton wool
- Ping pong ball/small polystyrene ball
- Hot glue gun/PVA
- Small pompom (for the nose)

Cut the card and stick to make a cone shame (this is the body).

- 2. Cut the felt into a slightly smaller cone for the hat.
- 2b(optional) stitch the bottom of the hat using a blanket stitch.
- 3.Stick a bit of cotton wool to form a beard tucking under the hat.
- 4. place the hat and beard on to the body and stick with hot glue or PVA.
- 5. Stick the mini pompom on to make the nose.
- 6. Now make it your own with decorations

Read a story featuring a troll.

Design your own troll

Have a look at some pictures of norwegian trolls. Why not design or make your own troll – don't forget to give it a name. Why not write a short story about your troll.

Moomins

Watch an episode of the moomins or watch the new moomins film.

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Fish

Norway is very well known for its fish – including Salmon, trout, cod and crabs

Play fishy fishy fishy

Go fishing

If you cannot physically get out and fish why not make a fishing game – each person decorates a large fish and sticks a magnet to its mouth. Then using a bamboo cane some string and another magnet make a fishing rod for the girls to use to catch their fish.

Eat fish and chips

As a treat why not visit the local fish and chip shop.

What other fish can you try?

Guiding/Scouting in Norway

Currently there are 2 scouting/guiding movements in Norway – Norges Speiderforbund and YMCA-YMCA. The programme is structured around five themes

- 1. Outdoor life
- 2. Creativity
- 3. Friendships
- 4. Community involvement
- 5. Life quality

Norwegian guides and scouts love the outdoors. The activities being offered are unbelievable. We hope in this section to give you a taster of what we will be doing at the jamboree (scaled down to do in units)

Hiking

Go for a penny hike – take the girls for a walk around the local area. At every junction flip a coin – Heads = turn right. Tails = Turn left.

Or

Go for a hike using a map and compass. This could be in your local area or further afield. Take it further – challenge older guides and senior section to meet you at a coordinate point. Have them plan and carry out their route. This is also good practice for Duke or Edinburgh.

Catapults

Play angry birds. – At Nord, guides and scouts are expected to know how to build and use a catapult. Like the mobile phone game – stack some boxes, inflatable objects or stuffed toys at the end of a room. Using a sponge ball try and knock all the objects off the boxes.

Guides and Senior section could take this further by making a slingshot or catapults.

Remember to risk assess!

Rifle shooting – remember girls will need additional forms from guiding for this activity. If you cannot take the girls to a rifle range why not set up a range in your hall (risk assessment needed). You could use tins and water pistols or why not make targets and use Nerf guns? Please check the A-Z of activities due to the use of weapons – at time of writing Guiding does not allow the use of human or animal targets or shaped targets.

Pioneering

Have a go at pioneering – all groups at Nord are expected to make their own furniture out of pioneering poles. They are also expected to make their own subcamp gates for their camping areas. What can your group make?

Why not try on a miniature version – using lolly pop sticks or match sticks and embroidery thread?

Tunnelling

As part of our overnight hike we are expected to navigate through pitch black caves, which when Bodo never gets dark in the summer, will be quite a contrast.

Have a go at tunnelling or caving.

If you do not have a local centre why not try this activity in patrols in your hall. Using tables, chairs cardboard boxes, sheets and blindfolds – make a tunnelling system for another patrol to navigate through.

Rock climbing/Abseiling

As part of our overnight hike we are expected to abseil down a cliff edge at the end!!! Why not have a go at rock climbing and abseiling at your local centre.

Campfire

Have a campfire. Bring your best singing voice and camp blankets

Other Adventurous Activities

Have a go at other adventurous activities from kayaking to rock climbing. The wilder the better!

Wellies!!!!

As we have said above, our unit was formed off the back of Wellies and Wristbands. A festival held every year at Foxlease and Waddow so no pack would be complete without Welly activities!

Welly Wanging

Play a game of welly wanging – see who can throw them the furthest

Welly plant pots

simply add compost and seeds. Why not have a competition to see who can grow the tallest plant in a welly?

Welly Biscuits

Make Welly shaped biscuits. Be creative with flavours and don't forget to decorate them!



Splash in puddles (not just for rainbows! Seniors love it too and we have the proof!)



Water relay races

Have a water relay race using wellies. Fill your boots with water and off you go!

Upcycle

Recycle your old wellies into another useful object

Make a welly mascot.

Using old materials and recyclables why not make a welly mascot for your patrol/six or for your unit.

Make a welly animal.

More instructions can be found online. But using a few wellies why not see if you can make an animal or a monster or an alien? Make sure you send us your best wellies!

No welly activity would be complete without jazzing up some boring green wellies. If you have no wellies to decorate what would be on your perfect welly? Fur lining to keep your toes warm? Rubber ducks as the print?

Wellies and wristbands:

Guides/Seniors: Attend Wellies and wristbands

Older seniors: Why not volunteer at Wellies and Wristbands?

If you cannot attend Wellies and Wristbands why not have your own mini festival in your unit or with your district? Or what about a disco or similar. All you need is music, glow sticks and flowers in your hair..... oh and a pair of wellies!

Prepare for a festival

If you are going to Welly and Wristbands or another festival of sorts, why not make some accessories to wear. Think flowers in your hair, glow stick necklaces etc. Lots can be made out of scrap crafts





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
